### 1. Quick Check-In Around the Table Related to BH

- a. Diana Koelliker noted that Emergency Room has seen an expected and typical uptick in Mental Health emergencies and crisis intervention
  - i. Described this is very common during off season in teens and adults with substance use problems
- b. Therapists in the collaborative described similar circumstances
  - i. Mandy Miller sees the community having a good work/play balance during busy times but without the structure negative behaviors occur more
  - ii. Lindsay Wright noted a huge uptick in clients seeking EMDR
- c. Emmaline Cochrane, Behavioral Health Care Coordinator is working on updating crisis workflow since there is no longer CORE in our community
- d. Tri-County Health Network hosting a celebration of life service for our community
  - i. Over the past 18 months, we had 40 deaths in our community
- e. Robert Garcia discussed mental health awareness month events through Tri-County Health Network, discussed NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness)
  - i. Jennie Thomas suggested keeping NAMI groups remote to increase participation
- f. Collaborative discussed its involvement with the NAMI Chapter
  - i. Jennie Thomas really supports the model and wants to encourage innovative ideas on how to get community members to join
  - ii. Lindsay Wright noted that in the past she has given clients NAMI support group information but does not know how many people have followed up with the recommendation
  - iii. Mandy Miller suggested that some people don't identify with the term "mental illness" so leaving that out of marketing might connect with more people
  - iv. TCHNetwork will reach out to past family to family support group participants
  - v. Encouraging all to share support groups and chapter information to community members and clients
- g. Laura Byard described the Center for Mental Health received a grant for members of Telluride and Norwood struggling to find employment due to their mental health
  - i. Grant allows CMH to see what individuals' needs are, what they are capable of and enjoyed doing in the past, and help identify another skill set
  - ii. For individuals who have a combined mental health need that might be preventing them from getting employment
- h. Jennie Thomas working with Norwood and West End Schools doing great work with interventions, teaching DBT skills classes, individua and group counseling with students

Tri-County Health Network

- i. Parents supportive of services
- ii. Students referring themselves or other students, parent referrals
  - 1. Seeing a culture shift
- i. Ainslee Fessenden from the San Miguel Resource Center gave updates on the organization
  - i. Shannon Dean is no longer the Executive Director
  - ii. Currently in process of finding someone for that position
  - iii. SMRC has a therapy assistance fund program that provides six to then sessions for sexual assault and domestic violence survivors
  - iv. West End Advocate is starting a support group for survivors of Domestic Violence
    - 1. Contact her directly for location of the group
      - a. If it goes well in Norwood bringing it to Telluride
- Mandy Miller continuing work with Telski and ski patrol through funding through their health insurance
- k. Mobile Crisis Response through Integrated Insights now has two full time members working with mobile crisis team
  - i. Noted that all community members should be using the Colorado Crisis Line
  - ii. New members are Melissa King and Kristen White
- I. Mandy Miller noted that community wants to be as supportive as possible of the new crisis response model
  - i. However, people are now just going to ER or med center more often because they can get a sooner response then the mobile crisis response

### 2. Crisis Response Workflow Discussion

- a. Flow chart was created when San Miguel County had an emergency manager and CORE program on who to contact at what point of any time of community crisis
- b. Emmaline Cochrane and Cris Matoush are working on updating that flow,
- c. Goal is to have all stakeholders follow the same flow
- d. Wendy Crank noted that during the last Norwood Town Council meeting members asked for a group to come talk to them about the mental health resources in our community
- e. Integrated Insights wants community to understand CORE is different than Mobile Crisis Response
